IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Dual Enrollment:

- In collaboration with Holyoke Community College & Greenfield Community College, Smith Vocational High School students may dual enroll in a collegelevel course while still in high school!
 - HCC & GCC both have some funding available for high school students. This is on a firstcome-first-serve basis, so applying early gives you a better chance!
- If you are interested in attending college after high school, this is a great opportunity to learn the structure of a college-level course while earning both high school and college credit
- Classes taken at HCC or GCC cannot interfere with the school day. This means a class in the afternoons/evenings or online would be the best option.
- If your student is interested in taking a Dual Enrollment course next year, please have them come to Guidance. The applications are due **June 1st.**



Homework Help

Homework help is available to all students from 2:15–3:15 pm Monday–Thursday, with the exception of early release days and school vacations. The program will be held in the library. Transportation is not available, however we can provide daypasses for students to use the PVTA.

Co-Op:

Co-Op is the opportunity that is offered to qualifying 11th and 12th graders. This is when students will be out working at a placement instead of coming to school on shop days.

Students must meet the following requirements:

- Grade of 80 or above in Shop & Related
- Grade of 75 and above in all academic classes
- No more than 5 absences per trimester
- No more than 10 absences from shop or classes

SAT:

It is recommended that you take the SAT (for four-year college-bound students) the Spring of your 11th grade year and/or the Fall of your 12th grade year.

There are a few dates next Spring/Summer in case you are interested in registering. The SAT is not offered here at SVAHS so you will have to go to another location. Please see below:

May 7th --> you will need to register by April 26th

June 4th --> you will need to register by May 25th
